MEETING HELD SUNDAY AUGUST 1, 1976 AT 3.15 pm

AT 68 CARLTON STREET, CARLTON

1. Minutes of meeting held July 4 were presented and confirmed.
2. 3CR letters were presented including acceptance of our affiliation with 3CR and general notes.  
A discussion followed as to the making of programmes for 3CR. It was proposed that programmes be approved by a meeting of CAW and that if this was not possible, approval should be given by 3CR's representative/CAW office bearers.  
A motion was passed to this effect.  
  
It was suggested that programmes be made say every two months to ensure that they were technically good.  
  
It was countered by 3CR representative that even though the first few programmes might not be technically very good, 3CR appreciated the very fact that the programmes were being submitted and encouraged new material as much as possible. It was stated that the response to programme making from other affiliated groups within 3CR had not been very good.  
  
A call for volunteers to make programmes for 3CR was made. Accordingly, the first three programmes were spoken for. These programmes being made fortnightly, to be broadcast on Tuesday evenings at 7 O'clock.
3. It was proposed that statements about CAW to the media be approved by the group. A motion was passed stating this.  
  
A suggestion was made that a statement be written out to hand to the media, should the occasion arise, to avoid the situation of an incorrect statement being printed.  
  
A member volunteered to do this when/if the situation arose.
4. Mural  
  
A report was made that the mural had been completed and that the "Herald" had done an article on murals, including the CAW mural to advertise 3CR, with photographs accompanying the article.
5. Work in Progress
  - (a) More Blinky Bill posters printed, (a call was made for volunteers to help print more posters).
  - (b) ACS posters printed advertising forthcoming exhibition.
  - (c) A model was presented on the lines of the Lygon Street mural.  
This model (on a large scale) could be used at Moomba for example, perhaps on a flat. A request was made for a carpenter to help construct the model.
6. "Festive Week"  
  
It was announced that there is to be a "Festive Week" at RMIT and that CAW would be paid \$50 to put on a display of work there, on the same lines as the previous exhibition.  
  
A call was made for some people to get together a catalogue and a poster advertise the exhibition. RMIT would do the typing and printing. Arrangements were made for people to look after the exhibition and set it up. The exhibition is to be on Saturday August 14.  
  
It was decided that if any of the public wanted to buy items in the exhibition they could contact CAW who would put them on to the person who owned the particular item.
7. Henry Lawson Poster  
  
It was proposed that we do a Henry Lawson poster with a poem of his at the bottom.
8. Finance  
  
The bank account had been opened and \$20 had been deposited which had been raised from Blinky Bill posters. \$5.25 had been spent on tapes for 3CR programmes.

It was proposed that photos be purchased from the "Herald" with a limit of \$15 to spend ie perhaps on ten photos.

9. Independent Australian

Drawings for the next edition can be submitted for feature pages in the magazine. Perhaps those used at the exhibition could be used? It was requested that drawings be given back to people reasonably quickly and in good condition, when they had been submitted for entry in the Independent Australian.

10. Illustrations for children's book

It was announced that someone writing a children's book (to include simplified dialectics and elementary communist thought) had asked CAW to provide illustrations. It could be screen printed using four colours - in an Australian context. It was decided this be further discussed when something concrete was presented by the writer.

11. Victorian Football Association (affiliated group of 3CR)

VFA has given 3CR some boards around football ovals to advertise 3CR, and it was proposed by 3CR that CAW help paint these boards. A call for volunteers was made to do this.

12. The venue for the next meeting was decided upon - 203 Faraday Street, Carlton, to be held on Sunday September 5th at 3.15 pm.
